President Serene recapped the Backflow Preventer Issue for those present at the meeting. TCEQ does not require backflow preventers for new construction. All they require is an inspection of new construction to see if a backflow preventer is required. However, the Board has the authority to require backflow preventers on any water system users/customers it chooses. The Board can require everyone in the community (using the water system) to install Backflow Preventers.

Key Points

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President Serene reopened the Backflow Preventer Board discussion because the Board had been erroneously led to believe by the previous water system owners that all new construction required a backflow preventer. We had adopted that standard based on that belief. Further, TCEQ guidance states that even though the Board has the authority to require it, there is no necessity.

Vice President Watson proposed that the water system should be made 100% compliant with backflow preventers installed for every customer to ensure the safety of our water. This was based on an issue earlier in the year when the pump blew up at the well house and all of the water in the system was sucked back to the well house potentially introducing contaminants into the water system. Having backflow preventers installed by every customer and annual inspections is low cost insurance for the safety of our water. Because the language in the current service agreement is vague, recent new constructions will not be required to install a backflow preventer as long as no conditions exist (i.e. pools, sprinkler systems, livestock, etc.) that require backflow preventers. Going forward language in the service agreement will be modified to clearly state that all new construction will be required to install a backflow preventer at the water entrance regardless of hazard conditions. A clause will also be added to the service agreement for any homes that are currently metered and grandfathered in (not currently required to have backflow preventers) to install backflow preventers when the property transfers ownership. This will ensure that the water system will eventually reach 100% compliance.

Member Michael Sayers indicated that he would abide by any decision made by the Board. After all Board members weighed in, the Board agreed to Vice President Watson's recommended plan to bring the water system into full compliance by having all customers install backflow preventers as outlined in the Vice President's recommendation. The service agreement will be amended to better reflect this requirement.

President Serene provided an update on the broken master meter in the well house which tracks the amount of water pumped out of the well (required by TCEQ.) It has been out of service for 5 months. The master meter is still with the manufacturer for repair/replacement.

Vice President Watson informed the board that two out of the three pump savers have been installed. He has also contacted Aquatech to remind them to change out the nipples on the pump system from plastic to stainless steel. This has only been done on the new pump to date. It was determined that the pump house does not require a new roof, and probably does not need to have sealant painted on the walls.

President Serene informed that board that he had received an email from Mrs. Joan Robinson indicating that they have been very satisfied with the results from the twice monthly water system flushing. The board agreed to continue doing the twice monthly flushing, but would revisit the decision if severe drought conditions returned.

Decisions

The BSTWSC Board of Directors unanimously approved to amend the BSTWSC Service Agreement to require all future construction, in addition to the regular requirements for a backflow preventer, to also have a backflow preventer; or upon transfer of property of folks who are grandfathered to have one installed.
