### Topic: Call to Order, Quorum Determination and Approval of Previous Meeting Minutes

## **Topic: Water System Operations and Concerns**

Pollution Control Services Report monthly results are as follows: July 25, 2018 sample test results showed chlorine residual levels at .82mg/l and coliform was absent, so within standards.

Note: .2 to 1.0 milligram/liter is considered normal for chlorine residual levels.

TCEQ sent a request to all water system providers to review their drought contingency plans and to file a drought report. Notice of implementation of stage 1 drought restrictions will be sent to water customers with the next monthly bill.

Technical advisor Carl Schuman notified Vice President Andy Watson that a lot water meter connection possibly needed straightening or the customer might have trouble hooking up his water line to the connection. The water meter is already installed. The Board discussed that this should be the responsibility of the homeowner to resolve.

President Serene notified VP Watson that a lot owner recently contacted the Board to have a new water meter installed. VP Watson indicated that we still had a new meter in stock for the installation, and that he would order additional one(s) for future requests.

Technical Advisor Schuman notified the Board of a slow leak out of a header at the pump house, which appeared to have begun after the second vertical pump was installed. VP Watson added that while the new pump was installed, the electrical work (rewiring work from having to bypass the alternator when first vertical pump was installed) had not been completed either. VP Watson indicated that he would call Aquatech to have this resolved. Note: Now that both vertical pumps are installed, there is no need to bypass the alternator and the re-wiring to bring the alternator back on line needs to be completed.

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Technical Advisor Schuman notified the Board that with the growth of the number of water customers for BSTWSC, it was taking significantly more time to read the water meters each month. After a brief Board discussion, VP Watson moved to increase the monthly water meter reading service fee to \$75.00. Board Member Flint Lemon seconded the motion. The Board voted unanimously to approve the increase to \$75.00 per month for water meter reading services.
